


stand for, and cultivate a following by remaining true to an aesthetic—their own. This lesson was imparted to him by sculptor Jacques Lipschitz, a European-born cubist-turned-abstract romantic with whom Yurman apprenticed for a couple of years. "He said to me, 'You're young,'" Yurman recalls. "I was 23. And then he said, 'The most important thing is that you have to have a point of view, and to have a point of view takes time. Right now you're searching, but you have your hand—you have a feeling in what you do. You just have to develop your point of view and keep on evolving.'"

"We realized that we weren't modernists; we weren't abstractionists. We were classic in nature. We like classics and we like to draw from feelings of history, but we wanted to be contemporary. We chose cable to make all the expressions of our point of view," he says. His first collections were medieval and coptic-inspired creations, like open-ended, twisted bracelets called torques, and sported lots of cabochons.

These days the brand's appeal crosses status, gender and age divides. "We get the daughters, the sons, the fathers, the moms, the grandmas," Yurman says. His heart warmed the most when he caught word that Nicolas Cage swung by the company's store at the South Coast Plaza in Costa Mesa and bought an expensive, one-of-a-kind couture ring for his mom. "That sale gave me a lot of pleasure because it's a very unique piece that I worked on. And Nicolas Cage, for me, is a unique individual, too."

Farrah Fawcett once collected Yurman baubles, and Lynn Redgrave wore pieces from his Albion collection for her 1998 Golden Globe win. "She didn't wear her jewelry to the Oscars—and she lost," Yurman jokes. Jessica Simpson is such a fan that in September 2004 she stopped by the company's offices and main showroom in Tribeca. "She was wonderful," the designer says. "Very interested in how things were being made, and then just picking out pretty things. In the middle of her showroom tour she actually got a call and started screaming on the cell phone. I said, 'What? What?' She said, 'I just got *Dukes of Hazzard!*'"

In the Yurmans' proximity lucky things happen, not least of which is the growth of their own business. And yet the company remains very

Keep 'em guessing

"Whose dress is that anyway?" is a magical phrase. When even the most devout fashion follower can't ID the make of your Marni (or your Marchesa or Maria Cornejo), you know you've made a wise purchase. Eschewing the obvious is one way to not only stand out but to get more mileage out of your wardrobe, because a top that hasn't gotten 10 fashion editorials is a top that will get 10 more wears. This doesn't mean you have to shun your designer faves for obscure labels. Look at commercial ranges or resort lines for stealth buys. Pieces you plan to wear in heavy rotation—coats, pants, boots, sweaters, LBDs—should get the undercover treatment. Instead of the pink jacquard bubble-skirted Balenciaga dress, consider the white one; opt for the gray Marc Jacobs twist-at-the-neck dress instead of the leopard-spotted style. Low-key colors help achieve anonymity. (When in doubt, buy it in black.)

Of course, indie labels like 3.1 Phillip Lim and Réyes and high-street emporiums like Zara and Topshop (hitting U.S. shores soon) are the best places to round out your wardrobe. Look to them for party dresses, standout tops, and trendier things like vests and leggings—all items you can acquire without breaking the bank. Take a page from Sarah Jessica Parker and blend flashy, fun pieces—bright prints, electric heels—with well-selected basics like the perfect jeans or plain pencil skirts.

Keep it real

over, he seemed almost to ignore his predecessor. "I avoided going to the archive because it was so overwhelming," says Ghesquière. "I'm thankful I was given the time to catch the spirit of the house so I could intelligently integrate it into my work." *Balenciaga Paris*, a new book just out from Thames & Hudson, and a Balenciaga exhibit at the Musée de la Mode et du Textile in Paris (through January 2007) both capture the past and present of this venerable collection.

Ghesquière had no interest in re-creating Cristóbal Balenciaga's designs line for line. "I prefer inspiration to reproduction. I love the colors, patterns and shapes I found, but for me it's all about the power of clothes," he says. "My silhouette is very sharp, very defined. Even if an outfit's mood is gentle and sensitive, it has to show strength. Clothes have to do more today than merely make a woman feel beautiful. They should make her feel confident she can play the game and do it her way." It's no wonder that Ghesquière beams when he talks
